**Dear Parishioners,**

**Holy Week** is more than simply retelling the story of our salvation. It is rather an invitation for each of us to enter more deeply into the mysteries of Christ's death and resurrection as participants. By joining in the ancient and beautiful liturgies, we walk with Christ through his passion and death and come to the glory of the resurrection.

The triduum, as it is called, begins on **Holy Thursday** evening when we gather for the Mass of the Lord's Supper. No other Masses are allowed on this day. When Jesus and his disciples met that evening, they came to celebrate the Passover, a Jewish feast dating back to the time of Moses. They ate the seder meal and remembered how God delivered them from the slavery of Egypt. Our Eucharist is deeply rooted in this meal for that night Jesus declared the bread and wine of the Passover to be his body and blood that would save us from our sins. He also washed the feet of his disciples to impress upon them the importance of serving one another. Our Mass will begin at 7pm and will be followed by adoration until 11pm.

**Good Friday**, the only day the church does not celebrate Mass, is marked by a time of fasting. The official liturgy of the church focuses on the passion of Jesus from the Gospel of John. It is followed by veneration of the cross and a communion service. It begins at 5:30pm. (Earlier in the afternoon—3 pm—our 7<sup>th</sup> graders will re-enact the Stations of the Cross. All are invited to attend this as well.)

**Holy Saturday** concludes the Triduum with the Easter Vigil Mass. It begins with the blessing of the new fire at dark (8pm). The Easter candle is lit and the light of the risen Lord is carried into the church. Several scriptures are read and then, the Gospel of Jesus' resurrection is proclaimed. Following this we prepare for the baptisms of the catechumens. This year we have eight adults to be baptized along with others already baptized who will be received into the church. The vigil concludes with the Eucharist where our new members join us in communion for the first time. The service is long (2 ½ hours), but if you have never attended, I strongly encourage you to join us as we welcome these new members into the church and into our parish. It is perhaps the most powerful and beautiful of all the church's liturgies, for it helps us to understand how our own baptisms are a dying to an old life and rising with Christ to a new one.

Easter Sunday Masses will be held at the regular times of 7am, 8:30am, and 10:30am.

A few reminders: There is **no 4:30pm Mass** and there are **no confession** scheduled for next Saturday or any time after the Triduum begins. Morning Masses on Thursday, Friday, or Saturday will be replaced by morning prayer at the scheduled time. The Chrism Mass, will be held at the Cathedral on Tuesday at 6:30pm.

All through Lent we have been preparing spiritually to participate in the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. Of all the events we celebrate in our church nothing is more to the heart of our faith. Please join us in celebrating this Easter Triduum. You will be glad you did.
